As we consider the opening of John's Gospel and the New Year, we ponder the importance of beginnings. Beginnings set the tone. What is so important of this beginning on the heels of Christmas?

~The Dimming of The Light~

We have officially entered the time of the "Christmas Hangover". Do you know what I'm talking about? We are exhausted from all the preparations and the festivities. The family has returned from whence they came. The gifts have been unwrapped and the wrapping paper tossed in the trash. The laundry has pilled up with bath towels and guest bed sheets. ~A Light That Still Shines~

Culture and commerce have moved on. But often we too forget and move on. We forget that those Wise Persons, the Magi, were late to the party. They were not present that faithful night as our Christmas Eve services might lead us to believe. The natal star, the light that guided their way, did not cease to shine upon Jesus' birth. It continued to serve as a beacon to the faithful, guiding them to their future hope.

Earlier we read the beginning of John's Gospel. The writer is quick to remind us, from the very beginning that there has always been a Light in the darkness. The occasion of Christ's birth did not begin something entirely new...No, the birth of Jesus merely takes us back to the start.

In true poetic form John's Gospel sets the stage for this event and places it within a much larger story. "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." "...and {THIS} Word was with God..." Not only was Christ there, Christ was there with God. Before the foundations of the world as we know it took shape, Christ had a relationship with the Creator.

"...and the Word was God." Not to be confused, before we even make it out of verse one of chapter one, the writer asserts that this very Word was not only there in the beginning with God, but was and is God. The identity of this Word is not mistaken. This Word is God incarnate. This Word is Jesus!
