Our Hospitality Team would love volunteers to help with a Sunday! Sign up on the board outside the office or see Suzi Healy.




Mission & Service

A Martha's Home heads up from your Mission Committee. . . .


Martha's Home is a much-needed project of City Mission that will provide emergency shelter to mothers and children seeking refuge. The Mission is a less-than-ideal place to shelter women and children as their location also provides a low barrier shelter as well as sheltering homeless men.

In May, your Session and Mission Committee, based on feedback from the Congregation, voted to support this project by becoming a Founder of Martha's Home. As a Founder, First Presbyterian Church has pledged to contribute \$100,000 to the cost of renovations, outfitting, and operations of Martha's Home by May of 2026. Every Elder and Mission Committee member has committed to supporting this with a personal gift.

sumes on Friday, September 20, beginning at 12:00 p.m. in Room 112-113. We enjoy fellowship over our lunch and then dig into our study.




This year, we will be using Horizon's Let Justice Roll

Godly Play Returns September 8

Great! But what is Godly Play, exactly? The mission of Godly Play is "making meaning through story, wonder, and play." Godly Play invites children to contemplate and make their own meaning from the stories of God's interactions with humanity throughout the millennia of our rich tradition. Godly Play includes stories from the Old



and New Testaments, the sacraments, stories of Saints, and stories of modern day examples of people answering God's call, such as Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

Godly Play encourages wondering about the story, followed by play. Each week a story is shared, and as possible, mirrors the scriptures used in worship. Simple, yet beautiful, visual aids help tell the story, followed by a time of wondering. "I wonder how the sheep felt when it was separated from the rest of the flock?" Or, "which character in the story is most like you?" Following this, the children are invited to choose what they will do next – perhaps art, perhaps using the visual aids to re-tell the story (and they are free to choose any story). Toward the end of our morning, we read from the Bible and as time allows, share a snack. We are grateful for Heidi Croy who so beautifully leads our Godly Play!

New Opportunities for our Children and Youth during Sunday 2nd Hour Faith Formation:

First Sundays - M&M (Motion & Movement)

With our children remaining in worship on Communion Sundays, the kids have been asked to "sit still" for quite a while. This is a time we will get them moving with fun games and activities that allow them to exert their energy—and learn some team building skills as well!

Second Sundays - Mission

The kids will go from worship to the Great Room to assist with Community Dinner.

Third & Fourth Sundays - Worship Explorers

Our worship services can seem foreign to our young ones, so we will learn about the parts of worship and how worship shapes and reflects our faith. We will explore how kids can participate meaningfully in worship and provide leadership in our worship services. These Sundays we will explore various forms of music (singing, drumming, bells, etc.), discuss various parts of the worship service, write prayers, explore ways of telling Biblical stories through skits or creative readings, learn to participate in worship as greeters, ushers, liturgists,



Adult Faith Formation

In worship this fall we will use the Narrative Lectionary again as our guide to the scripture we hear on Sunday mornings and the texts Pastor Jessie preaches on. The narrative lectionary is a 9 month chronological journey through the Bible, that starts with creation and ends with the early church. Hope you enjoy another year through the story of God's engagement with and for us.



Several weekday Bible study options this

Pastor Jessie will lead a Disciple Bible Study beginning Tuesday, September 10, from 7:00-8:30 p.m. Remember Who You Are: This Disciple study examines the connection between memory and identity as the people of God. Participants will find common themes, including calls to remember, calls to repent, calls for renewal, and calls for community. In this study, there are 12 sessions on the Old Testament Major and Minor Prophets (except Daniel) and on the 13 New Testament letters. Disciple is an in-depth study and the book needed will be \$17. It is expected that reading will be done between classes each week.

A second opportunity is another Amy-Jill Levine study—Sermon on the Mount—A Beginner's Guide to the Kingdom of

Heaven. This will be a six -week study with both an evening and a morning option. Evening classes begin on September 30 and run to November 4. from 7:00-8:30 p.m. and morning classes begin on

Tuesday, October 1 and conclude November 5, from 10:30 a.m.-12:00 p.m. Leslee Kirkconnell and Elizabeth Wright are teaming up to lead. The books are \$12 (but one can attend the study without purchasing the book).

October 6: Mission Sunday & Peace and World Communion Sunday—Join us for a worship service where we celebrate the rich diversity and complexity of all of God's children around the world who share the same faith. At the end of the worship service, we will walk outside and re-dedicate the peace pole that was given decades ago. The Mission Committee will lead 2nd Hour following our dedication at the Peace Pole.
